I. ANNOTATION

The optional course “European Studies” offers basic knowledge on the history, treaties, structure, institutions, administration system and the perspectives of future developments of the European Union (EU). It includes the theory behind the ideas of the foundation and operation of EU as well as the public policy for their realization.

The thematic units of the program include the following topics: history of the European Idea and the foundation of EU; establishment of EU – treaties and conventions; structure of EU – basic institutions; functioning of EU – types of power (executive, legislative, and judicial), theories and practices; Foreign policy and security policy of EU; European educational space - organization and perspectives; Bulgaria and EU.

- *During the course “European Studies” the students will acquire the necessary knowledge and analytical skills in order to analyze such a diverse processes as the ongoing dynamic development in EU;*
